2. Request for Exemption of Real Estate and Personal Property Tax – Mr. Pennell said Ms. Peggy P. Garland, Secretary, Historic White Marsh Church, Incorporated has asked the Board of Supervisors to schedule a public hearing required by §58.1-3651 of the Code of Virginia for consideration of an exemption of real estate and personal property taxes for a property owned by this charity at 11040 Mary Ball Road, Lancaster, Virginia.

Mr. Pennell stated this matter has been continued from the January 27, 2011 regular monthly meeting at the request of the petitioner.

Peggy Garland, Secretary to the Board of Historic White Marsh Church, Incorporated, said they are requesting exemption of real estate and personal property taxes because they are a church. She said White Marsh Church was formed on September 17, 1792 and this is the oldest Methodist Church in the Northern Neck and very likely in Virginia. The building was built in 1848. The Virginia Methodist Conference was unable to continue to maintain the building and in 2002 gave the church to the board to do as it will. Since the board has

taken over the building, it remains a place of worship, gut they only do special services such as Christmas, Easter, July 4th, Labor Day. The building needs renovation and the board will maintain it. They currently maintain the cemetery and there are still spaces available. They will be having a Bluegrass Concert in March to raise money for renovation. The church is available for weddings and funerals. The Code of Virginia states any church or religious organization, religious domination operated exclusively on a non-profit basis, for charitable, religious or educational purposes is hereby classified as religious or charitable organization. She said a church is a church. They will remain a place of religious worship. She said this is the only historic church in Lancaster County not exempt from taxes.

Mr. Pennell stated a church is statutorily exempt from real estate and personal property taxes and asked why her board was making the request for an exemption.

Ms. Garland stated because they have paid taxes and currently paying taxes.

Mr. Pennell asked Ms. Garland if she and/or her board communicated with George Thomas, Commissioner of the Revenue.

Ms. Garland stated she was told the board needed to submit their request to the Board of Supervisors.

Mr. Pennell says if you are a church, your status is covered in the Code of Virginia.

Mr. Jenkins said because the Virginia Methodist Conference turned the church over to a private organization could be the reason they loss their tax exempt status.

Mr. Pennell stated he would assist Ms. Garland if she wishes to meet with George Thomas, Commissioner of the Revenue to resolve this issue.

3. <u>Bond Release – RAKS Sports Bar Restaurant</u> – Mr. Gill has received a request for the release of the bond issued for the Pump and Haul Septic Disposal at the now closed RAKS Sports Bar Restaurant located adjacent to Quarles Convenience Store in the Lancaster Courthouse area in District 2.

Mr. Gill stated at the April 30, 2009 Board of Supervisors meeting, the board approved, with a \$1,000 bond and three-year renewals, the pump and haul septic disposal requested by Karen C. Ray and Ronnie Cutting, who were renting this property for their restaurant, RAKS Sports Bar, located in the Lancaster Courthouse area. The restaurant has ceased operations and Ms. Ray and Mr. Cutting have requested that the bond be released.

Mr. Jenkins stated any future occupant would have to come back to the Board of Supervisors for a pump and haul septic disposal bond.

Mr. Palin made a motion to Release the Bond for RAKS Sports Bar Restaurant in the amount of \$1,000 and have the Building Official declare the structure to be unfit for human occupancy until such time as appropriate septic disposal arrangements are made.

4. <u>Lancaster Middle School Emergency Generator Upgrade Project</u> – Mr. Larson stated Lancaster County solicited bids for the Lancaster Middle School Emergency Generator Upgrade Project. The county received a total of five proposals. Mosby West, P.E., the Project Engineer and Scott Hudson, Chief of Emergency Services conducted reviews of each proposal. The following were the results of the bidding process:

Mr. Larson stated after Mosby West, P.E., the Project Engineer and Scott Hudson, Chief of Emergency Services reviewed the bids, it is their recommendation that the county reject all bids that were submitted since they all exceed the capital improvement funds reserved for the project and would like the Board of Supervisors to authorize the County Administrator to conduct further review of the generator needs and begin a new bid process.

Mr. Geilich made a motion to reject the Bids for the Lancaster Middle School Emergency Generator Upgrade Project since all bids exceed the capital improvement funds reserved for the project and authorize the County Administrator to conduct further review of the generator needs and begin a new bid process.

Ambulance Billing – Mr. Larson said staff has made the determination that
 Lancaster County would be better served by doing ambulance billing in-house
 within a pooling arrangement with other localities and managed by the Northern
 Neck Planning District Commission.

Mr. Larson stated it is increasingly the experience of localities in this area that the quality of service of ambulance billing organizations is universally poor. As an example, significant revenues are being lost because of a failure to follow up on Medicare denials. It is anticipated that start-up funding can be recovered within three to four years and that better service at a lower cost can be obtained immediately. The Boards of Supervisors for two of the four participating counties have approved the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). The Richmond County Board of Supervisors has continued action until its March 2011 regular meeting.

Mr. Larson said the County Attorney has reviewed the Memorandum of Understanding. After legal review he sent back a new agreement and document in a new format which is an Intergovernmental Agreement that has been provided for the Board of Supervisors review. The new agreement gives more clarification. The other three counties (Westmoreland, Essex, and Richmond Counties) will need to review because it is a whole new document. The start up cost will remain the same which is \$100,000 split between the four counties.

Mr. Jenkins made a motion to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement for ambulance billing services to include a commitment of \$25,000 as Lancaster County's share of start up costs.
